PCGNY Conducts Last Consular Outreach of the Year in Jersey City

NEW YORK, 3 November 2018 – In spite of a nor'easter threat, dozens of Filipinos and Filipino-Americans came out to Jersey City Hall Annex last 27 October to avail of consular services during the last Consular Outreach Mission of the Philippine Consulate General New York.

A total of 69 services were delivered on that Saturday –30 Passports; 16 Notarization/Acknowledgment; 18 Retention/Reacquisition of Filipino Citizenship; and 5 Civil Registry applications. A team from Social Security Services (SSS) was also on hand to give a briefing on their products and answer inquiries from the applicants.

Philippine American Friendship Committee (PAFCOM), in cooperation with the local government of Jersey City co-hosted the mission in the new government building of Jersey City which houses the Health Department. END
